## GP Referral Criteria - Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin ICS

## **Guidelines for Fertility Assessment**

- Couples should be advised to lead as healthy a lifestyle as possible while trying to conceive (see NICE Guidelines) including:
  - Limit Alcohol consumption to 1-2 units per week
  - Do not smoke
  - Ensure BMI is between 19 30
  - Have regular intercourse (every 2-3 days)
  - Men should avoid hot baths, saunas etc and wear loose fitting underwear
  - Men should take Vitamins A & E (recommended daily dose only), Zinc & Selenium (recommended daily dose only) and Vitamin C 1000mg daily. Inform of the importance of these nutrients in sperm production.
- 2. For female recommend Rubella Antibody Screening <u>plus</u> Folic acid 0.4mg daily while trying to conceive and through first 12 weeks of pregnancy.
- 3. If there is no pregnancy after 1 year of regular, unprotected intercourse, check luteal phase progesterone level (7 days before next expected period) and request a sperm function test.
- 4. If either of the couple have an identified cause of infertility a referral may be made sooner. Earlier referral would be indicated where there are clinical reasons for suspecting pathology, eg. oligo/amenorrhoea, previous pelvic infection/intra- abdominal gynaecological operations, PCOS or in the male genital tract trauma operations or infection. *Previous cancer treatment indicates early referral.*

## Referrals

- 1. Please be aware that the cut-off for NHS funding in assisted conception (IVF/ICSI etc) in Shropshire is age 40 (treatment has to be started before 40th birthday). Please consider referring any woman or her partner with suspected/known pathology sooner if age is a factor.
- 2. Ensure criteria are met in the Shropshire policy (link below)
- 3. Both partners names and dates of birth must be provided at the time of referral
- 4. All referrals but be one via the electronic referral portal.

Woman ≥40 years of age Patient may be referred for advice only but should be advised that

the chances of achieving a successful pregnancy are low

Man ≥55 years of age - Referral not recommended because of potential parenting problems. Including possible

serious illness or death of the man before the child reaches maturity.
